Old Towne East Suggestions

Olde Towne East is a neighborhood located in the historical Near East Side of Columbus, Ohio and is one of Columbus' oldest neighborhoods.

1 Olde Towne Tavern - 889 Oak Street, Columbus, OH 43205

The menu offers traditional bar food with a healthy, delicious spin, featuring many favorites with a few twists.

2 East Market - 212 Kelton Ave, Columbus, OH 43205

Right across the street from Columbus Brewing Co. Beer Hall. Wide variety of restaurant stalls: Mexican, Middle Eastern, Greek & Moroccan, Korean, Creole, Pizza, and more!

3 Local Cantina - Trolley Barn - 1644 Oak St, Columbus OH 43205

German Village Suggestions

German Village is a historic neighborhood in Columbus, Ohio, just south of the city's downtown. It was settled in the early-to-mid-19th century by a large number of German immigrants, who at one time comprised as much as a third of the city's entire population. It became a city historic district in 1960 and was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1974.

1 Schmidt's Sausage Haus - 240 E. Kossuth St, Columbus, OH 43206

Real German Food! House made sausages and bratwursts. We highly recommend the Bahama Mama and a jumbo cream puff!

2 The Old Mohawk - 819 Mohawk St, Columbus, OH 43206

Buzzing, longtime American tavern & former speakeasy serving creative sandwiches & turtle soup.

3 Roosters - 897 City Park Ave, Columbus, OH 43206

Outpost of a casual chain serving American comfort food & specializing in chicken wings.

4 Valters at the Maennerchor - 976 S High St, Columbus, OH 43206

Traditional German meals & drinks served in a cozy, 1907 brick house with a seasonal patio.

1 Tip Top Kitchen & Cocktails - 73 E Gay St, Columbus, OH 43215

A down-to-earth tavern offering plentiful draft beers & entrees such as pot roast.

2 Dirty Franks - 248 S 4th St, Columbus, OH 43215

Franks piled high with offbeat toppings are on offer at this informal restaurant.

3 Pecan Penny's - 113 E Main St, Columbus, OH 43215

Delicious smoked barbecue with traditional southern specialties, sides, snacks & desserts.

Bexley Suggestions

Our host city! A first-ring suburb of Columbus, Bexley is known for its historic neighborhoods, highly ranked public schools, and Main Street environment.

1 Rusty Bucket - 2158 E Main St, Columbus, OH 43209

Casual tavern chain with a sports-bar atmosphere serving comfort-food favorites & a long beer list.

2 Cafe Istanbul - 2455 E Main St, Columbus, OH 43209

Branch of a local Turkish chain, serving traditional fare in an atmospheric setting, with full bar.

3 Brassica - 2212 E Main St, Bexley, OH 43209

Featuring organic whole wheat pita, artisan tahini, nutritious chickpeas, antibiotic-free meats, and a tremendous network of local growers and craft brewers.

4 Peking Dynasty - 2210 E Livingston Ave, Bexley, OH 43209
